Preparing the Nurse for the Future: Transforming Nursing Education through Collaboration

Nearly a decade ago, through a deeply collaborative process, Oregon nursing leaders identified the need for a new kind of nurse, one who could provide leadership in a changing health care system, providing quality care to an aging and increasingly diverse population. The competencies they developed led to the establishment of a new system of nursing education – one which uses the excellent education resources of both the community colleges and university nursing programs in order to prepare more nurses with a bachelors' degree. This inspiring webinar gives the story of the transformation of nursing education, so that other groups might use lessons learned in Oregon for promoting educational reform in their own region.

The Curriculum for the Future The innovative competency-based, integrated & spiral OCNE curriculum was developed by faculty from both community colleges and university nursing programs. The curriculum is offered on 8 community college campuses and the 5 campuses of OHSU, with the final year delivered virtually. This webinar will take participants through major decision points in creating a new curriculum: developing competencies based on emerging health care needs; choosing curriculum model; crafting the curriculum standards with sufficient flexibility for natural variation among campuses; using advances in the science of learning in curriculum and pedagogical choices.

Transforming clinical education for deep learning OCNE faculty and clinical partners have collaborated to create a new model of clinical education – sorely needed in this era of limited clinical placements and demand for learning experiences outside traditional settings. The new model is currently being implemented on four OCNE campuses, and evaluated for its effectiveness on learning outcomes, staff nurse burden and student and faculty use of time. Join in a discussion about processes used to engage hundreds of partners in clinical education redesign, the pedagogical underpinnings of the OCNE Clinical Education model, critical elements of the model and preliminary findings from demonstration projects and the current evaluation.
